COMMUNITY SERVICE FOR PEOPLE WITH HIV/AIDS

Part of NHS West Sussex, this is a community based service for anyone living with HIV/AIDS or caring for someone affected, providing information and advice on services.

GENITO-URINARY MEDICINE (GUM) CLINIC

GUM clinic based at the Warren Browne Unit, Southlands Hospital, offers HIV related services including HIV testing, pre and post test counselling, health advice and outpatient care. A team of doctors, nurses, health advisers and ACT counsellors are available for prompt diagnosis and treatment of genital infections or sexually transmitted diseases.

MID SUSSEX BODY POSITIVE (SUSSEX AIDS HELPLINE)

Provides advice, information, support and services for people affected by HIV and AIDS.

PSYCHOLOGICAL THERAPIES SERVICE FOR HIV AND SEXUAL HEALTH

The service provides a range of high quality specialist interventions, which promote and maintain the psychological well-being and health of individuals and groups affected by HIV, and/or those who are vulnerable to high sexual risk-taking, individuals experiencing sexual dysfunction and individuals who have experienced sexual trauma and have related sexual health problems.
