TYPE TALK, TEXTDIRECT AND RELAY ASSIST

Enables people with communication problems to make phone calls. Typetalk Relay Service operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week and is accessed by making calls through BT TextDirect. TextDirect converts ringing and busy tones into text messages that are displayed on the textphone. A prefix used before the number being called brings a Typetalk Relay Assistant into the call if required. Ringing the 18000 number will put callers in direct contact with the 999 emergency services. Typetalk is managed by RNID, TextDirect is provided by BT.

CLUBS FOR PEOPLE WITH VISUAL IMPAIRMENT

- **East Preston and Angmering** - Social club for visually impaired people who live in East Preston and Angmering. Have outings for tea and day trips. All members collected and returned to their homes.
- **Ferring** - Group for visually impaired people of all ages, fortnightly on Wednesdays at 2pm. Accessible transport is available if needed. The club can accommodate people with visual impairments who may also have other disabilities and the venue is wheelchair accessible.

- **Findon** - Social club for people with a visual impairment which meets and provides outings and entertainment. Meets 2nd Thursday of each month, 10.30am-12noon.
- **Lancing** - Coffee mornings held on the 1st and 3rd Mondays of every month between 10am and 12noon. Transport can be arranged. Building on ground level, with wide doors, wheelchair access and parking facilities available.
- **Lancing Self-Help Group for the Blind and Partially Sighted** - Provides social and creative activities, and outings for visually impaired people. Club meets on Thursdays 10am – 3pm.
- **Littlehampton and District Visually Impaired Self Help Group** - Social club for people who are registered blind or partially sighted. All transport provided. Offers befriending, society, lunches and outings.
- **Littlehampton Social Club** - Social club for people who are blind or partially sighted. Meets 2nd and 4th Monday at 2pm. Provides outings and has entertainment, bingo and singers.
- **Southwick** - Coffee morning for people with visual impairment. Meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of the month, venue is wheelchair accessible throughout
